## Season's greetings

As 2021 comes to an end, we wanted to give you a quick update on the redevelopment and reflect on a memorable year as we look ahead to 2022.

### Planning application submitted

We have now submitted a planning application for the redevelopment of Hayes Town Centre Estate, an important step in the project as we need to receive planning permission before any demolition and construction of the new homes can begin.

Thank you to everyone that attended our recent public consultation events. Your feedback continues to shape the design proposals that have been submitted.

The planning application is for the detailed designs for the first phase homes and outline information for future phases. As part of the

planning process, the council's planning department will be undertaking their own consultation with residents, neighbours, and stakeholders. You should receive a letter, or see a notice displayed around the estate, explaining how to get involved in this consultation if you want to.

We will be in touch in the new year to update you on how the planning application is progressing.

## Looking back on 2021 – what we have achieved so far...

### Residents vote 'YES' for regeneration

In spring 2021, eligible residents on the estate had the opportunity to vote on if they wanted the redevelopment to go ahead. 94% of eligible residents voted and we were delighted that 79% voted YES for redevelopment.

Thank you to everyone who got involved.

### Continued engagement with residents

Following the ballot result, we held a number of resident workshops and public consultations in summer and autumn to give you an opportunity to have your say on the more detailed design choices for the new estate.

The architects prepared models of the new homes for us to show residents, plus options for the different types of building materials and ideas for new landscaping and play areas.

We have really enjoyed these events and all the feedback you have given us throughout the year has been an important part of the design process.

### Resident Engagement Panel

We have now set up and hosted two meetings for the Resident Engagement Panel as part of our ongoing engagement with residents. This group is managed and chaired by your Independent Tenants and Leaseholder Advisors, Public Voice.

The panel provides a platform for discussion between the residents, the council, and the developer (once appointed), giving residents the opportunity to give detailed feedback on the design proposals and housing matters.

The panel will be meeting regularly next year. Please do get in touch if you want to find out more about the panel and how you can get involved.

### Re-housing residents

Since the ballot result was announced, we have successfully helped 12 families move into homes that better suit their needs.

We have had lots of positive feedback from residents on their moves so far, and we are excited to continue working with more families in 2022.

## **Regeneration Hub**

As you may know, we have been working on adapting the residents’ room into a dedicated regeneration hub so that we have a base on the estate to answer any questions you may have about the redevelopment.

The hub is open Wednesdays and Thursdays between 10am and 12pm, and 2pm and 4pm, for residents to drop-in and see us.

Please note that the Regeneration Hub will be closed to the public from Thursday 23 December and reopened on Wednesday 5 Jan 2022.

Alongside the sessions for residents, we are also pleased to have been able to welcome back the Sewing Club to continue delivering classes to residents.

## **Community support survey**

Alongside the regeneration, we would also like to work with you on new community projects to improve the lives of all residents.

We will be continuing to engage with residents as the detailed designs for the later phases progress whilst preparing for the start of construction on the first phase at the end of the year.

We will be organising visits for residents to view similar redevelopments around London, giving you an opportunity to get an idea of what the new estate might feel like. Keep an eye on future newsletters for more details on these events.

### Start of demolition

We are still on track to start work on phase one of the redevelopment by the end of 2022.

Once we have planning permission and have selected a development partner in spring, we will start preparing for demolition, keeping residents updated on our progress with regular newsletters throughout the year.

### What activities would you like to see?

There will be lots of opportunities to get involved with the regeneration in 2022 and we are still working on our programme of events and activities.

Are there any events you would like us to organise? What about clubs and after-school activities? Get in touch and tell us your ideas and we will see what we can do.
